Dictionary Definition : Swishing - To rustle, as silk Our definition : Swishing - To rustle clothes from friends

Rules of the Rail:

1. Clothes must be collected no later than the day before the event
2. One item donated = 1 swap credit
3. Minimum of one item, maximum of 4 items
4. Clothes and accessories donated must be in good condition
5. You will have half an hour to browse before the Swish opens
6. No item may be claimed before the Swish opens
7. As soon as the Swish is declared open, everyone may take what they want.
8. Remember - no scratching, spitting or fighting!
9. Any left over clothes will be given to charity
